Emergence of new n-gram meanings

usage possibilities for n-gram change with time, and a MWE usage may emerge example smashed it

old use: destruction/impact, as in (from 1995)

the wind lifted his three-car garage and smashed it to the ground.

recent MWE usage: meaning 'excelled', as in (from 2013)


sensational group CEO, totally **smashed it** in the BGT (Britain Got Talent)

question is:


Can such **emergence** of an MWE-usage be detected from untagged time-stamped text?


Model and Training
